

ORDINANCE NO. 421

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE SECOND-HAND STORES
AND JUNK DEALERS IN THE CITY OF ROSWELL, AND
FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, in order to protect the public health and safety, it is necessary to regulate second-hand stores and junk dealers; therefore

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. That no second-hand store or place of business in which second-hand goods or junk are kept, sold or offered for sale within the City of Roswell, shall keep therein or sell, or offer for sale therein, any food stuffs or other like provisions to be used for human consumption.

Section 2. That all dealers in second-hand goods or junk in said city shall at all times keep the same in a store-room, warehouse, or other enclosed building, so as to protect the same from the weather, to prevent the accumulation of water, or other trash and substances such as will make the same a nuisance, and to protect the same from petty sneak thieves within said city.

Section 3. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$100.00 for each offence, and each day's violation thereof shall be construed as a separate offence, or confined in the city jail for not less than ten days nor more than thirty days for each offence, by the court trying the same, and each day's violation of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offence.
