

ORDINANCE NO. 841

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SUBSECTION 6 OF SECTION 2, ARTICLE VI OF ORDINANCE NO. 807 OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HEREWITH; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND, DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL,  
NEW MEXICO:

1. That subsection 6 of Section 2, Article VI of Ordinance No. 807 of the City of Roswell, New Mexico, be, and the same hereby is, amended to read as follows, to-wit:
  6. Nurseries and truck gardening, but not the raising or keeping of livestock; or the raising or keeping of pets and/or poultry on a scale that such raising or keeping of pets or poultry shall be or become objectionable to inhabitants of the vicinity by reason of noise, odor, flies, excreta, sanitary conditions created thereby, or such other considerations as shall constitute, be, or become a public nuisance or in the nature thereof and, as shall be detrimental to the public health and welfare.
2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or parts of any ordinance heretofore repealed.
3. That if any section, paragraph, clause or provisions of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any other part of this Ordinance.
4. That this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public health, peace, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Roswell, Chaves County, New Mexico, and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure on the ground of urgent public need; and therefore, immediately upon its final passage, shall be recorded in the book of ordinances of said City kept for that purpose, authenticated by the signatures

of the Mayor and the City Clerk, shall be published in the Roswell Daily Record, a legal newspaper published and of general circulation in said City, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect five days after such publication.
