ORDINANCE NO. 869

AN ORDINANCE MAKING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS UNDER THE URBAN RENEWAL LAW AND ELECTING TO HAVE URBAN RENEWAL POWERS EXERCISED BY THE URBAN RENEWAL AGENCY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Roswell, New Mexico, did on the 11th day of October, 1966, adopt Resolution No. 1269 finding that one or more slum or blighted areas exist in the City of Roswell, New Mexico, and that the rehabilitation, conservation, redevelopment, or a combination thereof, of such area or areas is necessary in the interest of the public health, safety, morals and welfare of the residents of the municipality, and

WHEREAS, it is hereby found that it would be in the public interest to have the urban renewal project powers defined in the Urban Renewal Law of the State of New Mexico exercised by the Urban Renewal Agency created by Section 17 of said law, being Section 14-47-17, N. M. S. A. , 1953.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROSWELL, NEW MEXICO:


Section 1. It is hereby determined that it is in the public interest for the Urban Renewal Agency created by Section 17 of the Urban Renewal Law of the State of New Mexico (being Section 14-47-17, N. M. S. A. , 1953) to exercise all of the urban renewal project powers granted by said law.

Section 2. In accordance with the powers vested in the City of Roswell, New Mexico, by the Urban Renewal Law of the State of New Mexico, being Laws 1965, Chapter 300 codified as Sections 14-47-17, N. M. S. A. , 1953, the City Council of said City of Roswell, New Mexico, hereby determines and declares that the exercise of all the urban renewal project powers defined in the Urban Renewal Law shall be by the Urban Renewal Agency of the City of Roswell, New Mexico, and such Urban Renewal Agency is hereby vested with all the powers, functions, rights, duties and privileges of said Urban Renewal Law.

Section 3. EMERGENCY. The provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and this ordinance upon final passage shall be in full force and effect five days after its publication.


