

RESOLUTION NO. 1897

A RESOLUTION DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND AUTHORIZING IMMEDIATE ACTION AND PURCHASES UNDER AUTHORITY OF SECTION 13-1-15 N.M.S.A. (1978).

WHEREAS, the City of Roswell has heretofore entered into a lease of certain municipally owned farm land known as the "Tweedy Farm" and as part of said lease has obligated itself to promptly effect certain repairs to water supply equipment, and

WHEREAS, the shaft and bowls for a well on the leased property has failed and its repair is the responsibility of the City of Roswell, and

WHEREAS, such repair must be made immediately, in order to meet the terms of the lease, and in order to preserve the existing crops not under irrigation and thereby to protect the City from additional liability under the lease, and

WHEREAS, the Public Purchases Act, at Section 13-1-15 authorizes emergency purchases by order without bids in an unforeseen situation requiring immediate action to preserve property within the jurisdiction of the City.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED AND DECLARED by the governing body, the City Council, of Roswell, New Mexico, that an emergency situation necessitating immediate action exists in the instance of the well failure at the Tweedy Farm and that preservation of the crops and farm property involved requires purchase of parts and labor by order, without bids and further, that the City staff is authorized to proceed with such repairs in conformity with this resolution and the Public Purchases Act.
