

RESOLUTION NO. 2453

A RESOLUTION NAMING TWO CITY BUILDINGS

WHEREAS, the City of Roswell desires to honor L. O. "Tommy" Thompson, former Police Chief (1948-1964) and L. M. Hall, former Police Chief (1964-1978) for their long term and distinguished service to the City of Roswell and Chaves County, and

WHEREAS, the Roswell Police Station is named the James W. Stockard Building in honor of James W. Stockard, Mayor, 1906-1908, founder of the first motorized mail route and former owner of the police building site, and

WHEREAS, the Stockard family is willing to move the James W. Stockard name to the City Hall Building in order to accommodate to re-naming of the Police Station Building in honor of the two former chiefs, and

WHEREAS, the City Council Police Committee and the City Council Buildings and Lands Committee have conducted a public hearing on the naming of the two buildings and both committees have approved the name changes

THEREFORE, be it resolved by the governing body, the City Council of Roswell, New Mexico:

The City Hall Building be named in honor of former Mayor James W. Stockard and be know as the **JAMES W. STOCKARD BUILDING** and

The Roswell Police Station be named in honor of former Chief of Police L.O. "Tommy" Thompson and former Chief of Police L. M. Hall and be known as the **T. THOMPSON - L. M. HALL LAW ENFORCEMENT CENTER**.
